INTRODUCTORY LOCAL LAW NO. 4 OF 2021

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CERTAIN SECTIONS OF CHAPTER 297 OF THE VILLAGE OF WASHINTONVILLE CODE RELATED TO FIRE HYDRANTS AND PENALTIES

Be it enacted by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Washingtonville, County of Orange, State of New York as follows:

Section 1. Title.

This Local Law shall be referred to as "A LOCAL LAW A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CERTAIN SECTIONS OF CHAPTER 297 OF THE VILLAGE OF WASHINTONVILLE CODE RELATED TO FIRE HYDRANTS AND PENALTIES".

Section 2. Legislative Intent.

The Board of Trustees of the Village of Washingtonville are further protecting the healthy, safety and general welfare of the public by enacting the below revised changes to its regulations regarding the use of fire hydrants. It is a public health and safety issue to have unauthorized users of the Village's fire hydrants, and, as such, the within revisions become necessary to protect the public.

Section 3. Amendments.

Section 297-19 of the Village of Washingtonville Code is hereby repealed and replaced with the following:

- A. Fire hydrants are provided for the primary purpose of furnishing water for extinguishing fires and are to be used by the Village's Fire Department, Districts, Department of Public Works and/or Village authorized water operators.
- **B.** Any other person or persons who shall open or use any fire hydrant (for any purpose whatever) without a written permit for that purpose shall pay a penalty as set forth in § 297-28 for each offense.

Section 297-28 of the Village of Washingtonville Code is hereby repealed and replaced with the following:

- A. Any person or persons violating any of the rules, regulations and requirements governing the introduction, supply and consumption of water for which no penalty has otherwise been provided for the distinct violation shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay as a penalty for such violation a sum not to exceed \$2,500.00 for each offense or be subject to imprisonment for not more than twenty (20) days, or both.
- **B.** Whenever any person or persons has incurred any fine or penalty under the provisions of these rules, regulations and requirements, it shall be held to mean the sum designated, together with the cost of prosecution, and the penalties and fines herein referred to shall be in addition to any civil remedy which the Village of Washingtonville, New York, might have in an action of law against the party or parties offending.

Section 4. Severability.

If any part or provision of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person or circumstance be adjudged invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the part or provision or application directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this Local Law or the application thereof to other persons or circumstances, and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Washingtonville hereby declares that it would have passed this Local Law or the remainder thereof had such invalid application or invalid provision been apparent.

Section 5. Repeal.

All ordinances, local laws and parts thereof inconsistent with this Local Law are hereby repealed.

Section 6. Effective Date.

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the office of the New York State Secretary of State in accordance with section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.
