1 ALL: -- to the United States of
2 America and to the Republic for which it stands;
3 one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty
4 and justice for all.

5 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Can we start
6 off public comment and -- public comment. What?

7 MAN 1: Public comment, I have a
8 question. I see on your agenda you have a
9 resolution to set a meeting for May 5th to
10 discuss the adoption of the new and amended
11 zoning law. Is that -- amendments now available
12 anywhere?

13 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: The
14 zoning is still not released yet.

15 MAN 1: We're going to have a meeting
16 on May 5th and we haven't released the documents
17 yet?

18 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: It's the
19 public hearing for the zoning and the comment
20 together, and the zoning has not been released
21 yet. The Planner is still revising our final
22 comments.

23 MAN 1: When will the zoning changes
24 that are proposed be available, and will they be
25 available prior to the meeting on May 5th?

1 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: It will
2 be available prior to the meeting on May 5th.

3 MAN 1: Will it be posted on the
4 website?

5 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: It will
6 be posted on the website.

7 MAN 1: Thank you.

8 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: You're
9 welcome.

10 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Any other
11 public comment? Okay. Three items for
12 discussion, just an update on the extravaganza
13 event. Ran very well. Did very well with it.
14 Chorus, (indiscernible) and no issues anywhere.
15 (indiscernible) we've contacted them, and they're
16 going to work with us, giving us a credit for any
17 of the lights that were not working or in the
18 future are not working.

19 The Washingtonville Kiwanis Club spring
20 cleanup is Saturday, April 26th at Vern Allen
21 Park at 9:00 in the morning. The Village will
22 provide trash bags and gloves.

23 Now I'm going to get into resolutions.
24 First one is resolution 250022 to appoint -- I'm
25 sorry, to approve the purchase of a Honeywell

1 alarm panel and keypad. Basically a silent alarm
2 system from DMS Technical Design, LLC in the
3 amount not to exceed \$1,358.90 for Village Hall.
4 Does anyone have a motion?

5 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Motion.

6 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: Second.

7 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Motion passes.

8 401.

9 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: We need to do
10 it.

11 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Hmm?

12 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: We didn't
13 vote.

14 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: We didn't
15 vote yet.

16 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Oh, that's
17 right.

18 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: We just
19 had the motions.

20 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: I'm sorry. All
21 right, all in favor?

22 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Aye.

23 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: Aye.

24 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Aye.

25 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Motion passes,

1 401. Thank you for reminding me. Next one,
2 resolution 25-0023 to approve the purchase of a
3 copper press tool crimping kit to the DPW in the
4 amount not to exceed \$3,829.99 from Tool Factory
5 Outlet. They were the cheapest of the three
6 estimates we got. We got a motion?

7 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Motion.

8 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: Second.

9 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: All in favor?

10 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Aye.

11 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Aye.

12 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: Aye.

13 MAN 2: Can I ask you a question?

14 (indiscernible) is there something special about
15 this one? Because you can buy a -- like a home
16 usable one for \$250 to crimp it.

17 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: We looked, it's
18 a special tool.

19 MAN 2: Is it for iron or something?
20 Is it -- do you do iron?

21 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: (indiscernible)
22 copper.

23 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: It has to do if
24 -- for the border meters when the (indiscernible)
25 don't work, and we have to do it adjustments to

1 it, they can crimp it. And it covers the one
2 inch pipes up to the 2 inch pipes, 2 and a half
3 inch pipes.

4 MAN 2: Okay, so it's not a normal --

5 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Right, it's a
6 variable sized one.

7 MAN 2: Is that the only
8 (indiscernible) has one?

9 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Pardon?

10 MAN 2: The Village only owns one of
11 these?

12 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: We don't own any
13 right now.

14 MAN 2: Oh, okay.

15 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: But we're
16 starting to change up the (indiscernible) --

17 MAN 2: I'm sorry. I'm sorry.

18 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: We need to get
19 three estimates and --

20 MAN 2: Right, that's a very high end
21 crimper.

22 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: It's a very
23 specialized tool.

24 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: All right.

25 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: We do

1 read (indiscernible).

2 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Resolution 25-
3 0024 to approve the purchase of a foley machine
4 from (indiscernible) Company in the amount not to
5 exceed \$13,815. This cost is New York State
6 contract bid pricing and will be divided by the
7 three funds. Do we have a motion?

8 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: Motion.

9 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Do we have a
10 second?

11 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Second.

12 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Oh. All in
13 favor?

14 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: Aye.

15 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Aye.

16 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Aye.

17 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Motion passes,
18 401. Next one, to approve -- I'm sorry, 25-005,
19 to approve the purchase of a F-O-B, which is fob,
20 access system for Village Hall in the amount not
21 to exceed \$10,767.15 from DMS Design. This is
22 basically going to go away from the old key type
23 and there would just be a fob to get into certain
24 areas. Do we have a motion?

25 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Motion.

1 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: Second.

2 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Okay. The --
3 all in favor?

4 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Aye.

5 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Aye.

6 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: Aye.

7 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Motion passes,
8 0 -- 401. To our -- resolution 25-0026, to
9 authorize approval to the (indiscernible) of the
10 garage doors located on the (indiscernible)
11 public works building from Dutchess Overhead Door
12 Company in an amount not to exceed \$6,225. Do we
13 have a motion?

14 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: Motion.

15 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Any second?

16 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Second.

17 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: All in favor?

18 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Aye.

19 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: Aye.

20 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Aye.

21 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Motion passes,
22 401. Motion -- resolution 25-0027 to schedule a
23 public hearing to consider adoption of the
24 village comprehensive plan and amendments to
25 chapter 315, which is zoning to be held on

1 Monday, May 5th, 2025, at 7:00 p.m. at Village
2 Hall. Do I have a motion?

3 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Motion.

4 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: And a second?

5 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Second.

6 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Motion passes.

7 Or -- all in favor?

8 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Aye.

9 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: Aye.

10 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Aye.

11 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: 401. Next one

12 is resolution 25-0028 to authorize Millenium

13 Strategies, LLC to prepare and submit a grant

14 application on behalf of the Village of

15 Washingtonville here in New York State.

16 Department of Environmental Conservation. Board

17 quality and (indiscernible) grant regarding

18 (indiscernible) wells, hydro-wells, and a vacuum

19 truck, and a fee of \$4,500 into authorized Mayor

20 Tom Devinko to sign the project. Do I have a

21 motion?

22 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: Motion.

23 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Second?

24 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Second.

25 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: All in favor?

1 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Aye.

2 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Aye.

3 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: Aye.

4 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Motion
5 passes.

6 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Motion passes,
7 401. Resolution 25-0029 to declare surplus and
8 of no value to the Village of Washingtonville the
9 following two damaged radar street signs.
10 (indiscernible), serial number 975D like David,
11 and (indiscernible) serial number 50A like apple,
12 7. Do I have a motion?

13 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Motion.

14 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Second?

15 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Second.

16 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: All in favor?

17 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Aye.

18 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Aye.

19 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: Aye.

20 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Motion passes,
21 401. To authorize budget transfers -- resolution
22 25-0030, to authorize budget transfers and
23 amendments as necessary to effect necessary
24 transfer of funds and to pay those warrants.
25 Those numbers are coming out of the A fund is

1 \$33,600.18. And out of the water fund,
2 \$5,317.04. And there is nothing for
3 (indiscernible) this -- these two past weeks. Do
4 we have a motion?

5 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: Motion.

6 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Second?

7 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Second.

8 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: All in favor?

9 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Aye.

10 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: Aye.

11 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Aye.

12 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Motion passes,
13 401. The next one, we decided we're going to
14 table that one until probably next meeting so we
15 can discuss it further. Next one on here is
16 resolution 25-0032, to adopt bond resolution
17 authorizing the issuance of bonds in a principal
18 amount not to exceed \$730,000 to finance the
19 construction of road improvements, drainings and
20 paving project from Route 94 up North Street to
21 Toleman Road.

22 (indiscernible) and the first driveway
23 located at Taft Elementary School, stating the
24 estimate maximum cost thereof is \$730,000, and
25 prorating said amount for such purpose. Do I

1 have a motion?

2 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Motion.

3 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Second?

4 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: Second.

5 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: All in favor?

6 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: Aye.

7 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Aye.

8 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Aye.

9 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Motion passes,
10 401. Next one is resolution 25-0033, to
11 authorize the Village car to advertise for
12 business regarding drainage work on North Street
13 to (indiscernible) Boulevard. That they will be
14 set by the village engineer and village clerk.
15 Do I have a motion?

16 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Motion.

17 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Second?

18 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Second.

19 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Thank you, all
20 in favor?

21 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Aye.

22 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: Aye.

23 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Aye.

24 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Motion passes,

25 401. Our last one is resolution 25-0034 to

1 appoint a Village Board as lead agency and to
2 accept a completed CEQA environmental assessment
3 and EAF regarding sewer project. Can I have a
4 motion?

5 MAN 3: Before you do that, did we --
6 pardon me if I don't remember this, did we pass a
7 resolution declaring ourselves -- declaring our
8 intent to be (indiscernible) agency? More than
9 30 days ago?

10 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: I'm not
11 positive.

12 MAN 3: If we didn't, we need to do
13 that first. Under New York law, we have to
14 declare our intent to become the agents -- the
15 agency first. Circulate --

16 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO:
17 (indiscernible) the Village Board is lead agency.

18 MAN 3: Correct, but --

19 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: It has to
20 be -- so then, we can't accept it for 30 days?

21 MAN 3: Correct.

22 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: We -- oh.

23 MAN 3: You --

24 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: So this
25 is --

1 MAN 3: You have to --

2 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: -- in two
3 parts.

4 MAN 3: -- adopt your resolution to
5 declare your intent to be lead agency, circulate
6 it to the relevant Boards. You can also then --

7 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: 30 days
8 prior to actually sending the --

9 MAN 3: 30 days prior. They're not
10 going to say anything, almost certainly, but you
11 still have to follow that step. Assuming this is
12 a type one or an unlisted CEQA action. And I
13 don't have the CEQA forms in front of me.

14 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: And I
15 don't remember do -- declaring ourselves the lead
16 agency for --

17 MAN 3: Yeah, you'll need to do that
18 first.

19 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Does
20 anybody else? No?

21 MAN 3: So, you're changing your
22 resolution to declare yourself -- declares your
23 intent to be lead agency for the CEQA purposes.

24 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Okay.

25 MAN 3: Mm hm.

1 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Okay, carry a
2 motion?

3 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Motion.

4 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Second?

5 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: Second.

6 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: All in favor?

7 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Aye.

8 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Aye.

9 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: Aye.

10 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Resolution
11 passes, 401. Okay, this is the end, and we are
12 going to go into executive session --

13 WOMAN 1: Public comment.

14 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: All right.
15 Anybody have anything they want to say?

16 WOMAN 1: Michael.

17 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Mike Graziano, 3
18 Lark Street. First thing I want to do is preface
19 my comments to the Board, saying I really
20 appreciate everything you guys do and I know you
21 guys do a lot for our Village.

22 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Uh-oh.

23 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: That's why I want to
24 preface, exactly. All right? And I know what
25 you say, but sorry -- no matter what we do,

1 there's always somebody who's not happy. That's
2 not the case at all.

3 But I do want to bring up some issues
4 that I'd like to see really (indiscernible),
5 okay? I've grown up -- okay. So, what happens
6 is the public makes comments or suggestions, they
7 get discussed at that meeting, but then they have
8 to be followed up three months, six months later,
9 because we don't know if any actions were taken
10 on it.

11 And I'll give you an example.
12 Crosswalks. I know Tom had said that the state
13 was going to do crosswalk buttons, and then Tom
14 said the state was going to do an upgrade on
15 that. I know that one button's been replaced in
16 the Village with a new arrow or something like
17 that.

18 But the others have not. The other day
19 I was walking from (indiscernible) Company
20 towards the Village and I was going to go across
21 Brotherhood Plaza Drive, hit the button that --
22 thinks it would be obvious that you'd want to
23 cross Brotherhood Plaza Drive and that button --
24 that gives me the walk signal, the one across 94.

25 It's not -- it's definitely not

1 intuitive, and it needs to be fixed, okay?
2 Another thing I brought up probably a year or two
3 -- but, no, probably about a year ago. Do not
4 walk the box. We talked about North Street, and
5 we talked about the dance studio where they put
6 pavement markings to prevent people from blocking
7 North Street.

8 What happens is, you come down 208
9 South and you take a left, and then you try to
10 take a left onto North Street, people are
11 blocking the intersection. We need those
12 markings to prevent that from happening. Once
13 again, this is something I raised a long time
14 ago. There's still a problem with a commercial
15 business on Lark Street and then you guys
16 addressed that, but I have video and stuff where
17 they're bringing in a backhoe on a trailer.

18 You're still -- they still have
19 firewood that they're cutting up and selling, I
20 assume. And it's not completely resolved. I
21 thought it was, but they're still coming in.
22 Like I said, I have video if you'd like to see
23 that.

24 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: He did
25 rent another place.

1 MICHAEL GRAZIADO: Yes, I know he did.

2 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: But
3 there's still activity going on?

4 MICHAEL GRAZIADO: There's still
5 activity.

6 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Okay.

7 MICHAEL GRAZIADO: They're still
8 bringing in a backhoe every now and then. It's
9 not as bad as it used to be, but there's still --
10 and I understand a neighbor up the street had to
11 come down and talk to the Village about this
12 about three weeks ago, four weeks ago. I don't
13 know the outcome, I never spoke to this gentleman
14 about it, but I know he came down from what I've
15 been told. So, I'd like to just follow up on
16 that as well.

17 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: That was
18 not brought to my attention and I do meet with
19 the Building Department, so --

20 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Okay -- yeah, okay.

21 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: -- we'll
22 follow up.

23 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Thank you. The
24 other issue I want to talk about is the entrance
25 to the Washingtonville Cemetery. Not from North

1 Street, but from 208. That gate is now closed
2 and locked, okay? I assume that is a right of
3 way going into that cemetery. If you're going to
4 lock the gate, I think what we should do is at
5 least make a pedestrian gate so people could walk
6 through there.

7 Right now it's -- you can't get through
8 there. You either have to walk around --
9 whatever. It's just -- a lot of people do walk
10 through there, I know a number of people that,
11 when we walk through there we see people and
12 stuff, but you can't get out that way anymore.

13 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: This is
14 the 208 entrance you said?

15 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: So -- 208 entrance,
16 yup.

17 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: So, Mike, I'm
18 sorry, I'll let you finish, go ahead. I can use
19 something.

20 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: No, that's good. I
21 was just -- that's -- so, okay, so that's that.
22 Okay, so what I'd like to ask the Board is that
23 when we make suggestions, you guys are morally
24 welcomed to say whether or not you want to adopt
25 those ideas. You guys can discuss it, get back

1 to us in two weeks or a month, maybe two meetings
2 or something.

3 But I'd like to keep a list of these
4 things on the agenda and give us a status update
5 to say, crosswalk signals -- or, we called the
6 state, and they're working on it.

7 And then maybe next meeting or two
8 meetings or three meetings from now, no action by
9 the state. Something like that. Or the state's
10 working on it. So -- or we're working on getting
11 the -- what was the other thing? They -- do not
12 block the box, or something like that. Where we
13 are with these issues.

14 Because I don't really want to -- and
15 I'm sure nobody else does, want to bring these
16 things up time and time again, because you feel
17 unsafe. So, I would just ask that -- so, what
18 I'd like to do is just discuss those issues,
19 right? Do we have any word on the crosswalk
20 cross buttons? I mean, the buttons?

21 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Tom's been
22 handling that, I know he did talk to the state.
23 They said they were going to take care of it.

24 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Okay.

25 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: And that's as

1 far as I know.

2 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Yeah. But you see
3 that's --

4 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: (indiscernible)
5 fix one, like you just said.

6 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Yeah. That's
7 something that --

8 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Why they didn't
9 do them all at the same time?

10 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Right.

11 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Is beyond me.

12 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Okay, that's
13 something that we really need to try to get some
14 more action from the state. If they're not
15 following through --

16 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Good luck with
17 that.

18 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: We need to --

19 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: We know how
20 hard it is.

21 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: -- be on the phone
22 with them and asking them. What did you want to
23 say, Sue?

24 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Oh, in regards
25 to the cemetery, because I've been back and forth

1 with the group that helps maintain it and does
2 all the work for the historical markers.

3 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Mm hm.

4 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: So, the cemetery
5 is still under control by the church. The church
6 had requested that those gates be locked, because
7 what was happening is people in cars were cutting
8 through the cemetery to avoid the light in town.

9 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Okay.

10 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: That's why it's
11 gated closed.

12 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: I had that written
13 down, however that cannot be the case, because
14 there's been a green dumpster there that the
15 people have that have been in front of that gate
16 that I have to walk around when the thing was
17 open. So, that hasn't happened --

18 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: But it's not up
19 to us to lock it or get it unlocked.

20 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Okay.

21 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: That's the
22 church that's doing it, it's not the Village.

23 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Well, isn't that a -
24 - is -- has nothing to do with the Village?

25 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Nothing

1 whatsoever.

2 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: The Washingtonville
3 Cemetery?

4 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Nothing.

5 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Nothing. Okay. So,
6 there's not a right of way there or anything?

7 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Nope.

8 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Okay. All right.

9 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: I spent a lot of
10 time researching it, so...

11 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Okay, so did we
12 suggest to them that they maybe just leave a
13 walkway through so people can go through?

14 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: I -- listen, I
15 asked too. I said well, what if we put in two
16 stanchions, left it open --

17 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Right. Yup.

18 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: -- and it's --
19 it -- the end of the day, it's that the church
20 will not give up control of the cemetery to the
21 preservation group.

22 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Okay.

23 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: -- that's --
24 that maintains it.

25 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Okay.

1 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: They've been
2 trying for --

3 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Okay.

4 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: -- five, six
5 years now --

6 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Okay.

7 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: -- to have the
8 cemetery turned over to them. It's strictly, I
9 would --

10 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Okay. I'll follow
11 up with them. I'll follow up with them.

12 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Yeah.

13 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: And I'll ask them.
14 I'll ask them why they won't consider just
15 putting a walkway through there.

16 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Or putting up
17 two stanchions.

18 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Just two stanchions,
19 yes.

20 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: So you can't
21 drive through it --

22 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Exactly.

23 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: -- but you can
24 walk through it.

25 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Yeah. Yeah. Right.

1 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: They can put up
2 half lally columns, like we do in front of
3 boilers.

4 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Yup.

5 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Cars not going
6 to ram through that, and it's concrete filled
7 lally column.

8 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Yeah. Yeah. So,
9 okay. So, just to summarize, some of the issues
10 have been raised, I would just like to see it on
11 the agenda after you guys decide whether or not
12 you even want to pursue it. If you say to me,
13 Mike, we're not going to talk about the -- you're
14 -- we're closing that issue out, whatever it may
15 be, or whoever it is.

16 We're going to close that issue out,
17 we're not going to pursue it. That's fine. If
18 you guys decide that, that's fine. You're the
19 Board. But, if we do decide to pursue it and we
20 should keep it on an agenda so we get an update
21 on it until the issue is resolved. Because I
22 think things happen to fall off sometimes, and
23 they get lost. All right?

24 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: What you're
25 saying's not a bad idea, and we try to do

1 everything that residents asking of us.

2 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Oh, I know you guys
3 do. Absolutely.

4 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: And --

5 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: And often
6 we'll handle it by getting back to the resident,
7 if we take notes every time there's a public
8 comment that we need to pursue and follow up on.
9 We contact the resident that brought it up.

10 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Yeah.

11 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: And you
12 know, because we've done that with you as well.

13 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Yes. I know. I
14 know, you guys have. But I think it would be
15 better if it's on the agenda, this way we --
16 people are aware of it. Is that possible?

17 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Chris and
18 (indiscernible), is that --

19 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: I mean, if the list
20 gets -- it's out of control.

21 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: -- it --
22 can we add every public comment onto the agenda
23 for -- like on a discussion?

24 MAN 3: I mean, theoretically you
25 could, I don't know that I would suggest it.

1 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Yeah.

2 All right. We'll discuss.

3 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: Okay.

4 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: We'll
5 talk about, and see if it's --

6 MAN 3: Yeah.

7 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: --
8 feasible and realistic.

9 MAN 3: Mm hm.

10 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Because
11 you know how many comments we get sometimes in
12 one meeting? You know --

13 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: This has been a
14 good one.

15 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: This is
16 quiet tonight, but there are times where our
17 meeting could be done in 30 minutes and we're
18 here an hour and a half because the rest of it
19 was public comment, so I guess it depends on what
20 makes sense and that type of a thing.

21 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: All right.

22 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: I'll talk
23 to Tom it.

24 MICHAEL GRAZIANO: All right.

25 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Good

1 suggestion, though.

2 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Right, it
3 is a good suggestion.

4 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Anybody else
5 have a public comment that --

6 MAN 4: Yeah, (indiscernible). So
7 Steve, just for continuity (indiscernible). Just
8 for continuity in the meeting (indiscernible).

9 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: We have a
10 meeting 28th, 29th of this month.

11 MAN 4: Okay.

12 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Hopefully we'll
13 close it out then.

14 MAN 3: Okay.

15 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: We're trying.
16 You know all that stuff is done, it's just legal
17 BS. You could blame him or his bullshit on.

18 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: His industry.

19 MAN 3: What, me?

20 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: It seems to be
21 my industry.

22 MAN 3: I mean, I get blamed for
23 everything now, so.

24 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: It was easier.
25 Brian's not here, so...

1 MAN 3: Yeah.

2 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Is he?

3 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: No.

4 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Oh, oh.

5 MAN 3: What's that? Friend?

6 WOMAN 1: No, no, Brian.

7 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Anybody else
8 have any public comment? Going once, going
9 twice. Done. Okay. So, we need to go into an
10 executive session.

11 DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: A motion
12 to go into --

13 MAN 3: A motion and the purpose.

14 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Personnel --
15 person -- personnel reasons?

16 MAN 3: Personnel reasons? Okay.

17 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: So, motion to -
18 -

19 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: Motion.

20 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: -- go into
21 executive session? Second?

22 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Second.

23 TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: All in favor?

24 TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: Aye.

25 TRUSTEE VERNON COLEMAN: Aye.

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DEPUTY MAYOR DONNA JACARUSO: Aye.
TRUSTEE STEVE PRESSER: Aye.
TRUSTEE SUSAN WALSKI: No decision will
be made.
